THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT DECEMBER 13, 2015

FROM THE DESK OF MSGR. JOHN CODY

Dear friends and parishioners of St. Christopher Parish:

1. The Holy Year of Mercy - Pope Francis is challenging all of us to devote ourselves to the practice of mercy. We tend to be hardhearted a lot, wanting severe punishment for everyone else but ourselves. Our Lord Jesus has said in Luke's Gospel and elsewhere, "Be merciful as your Father is merciful." This involves a change of heart on our part, and a willingness to forgive and forget - especially when there are people who have hurt us. Being merciful does not mean that we let everyone get away with anything. But it is a challenge for us to reconcile with one another and to allow people to learn from their mistakes. The woman caught in adultery, Zacchaeus in the tree, and the other sinners who were outcasts in society found a friend in Jesus. We too should be ministers of reconciliation. One excellent way to observe this Holy Year is to give emphasis to the works of mercy. In case you have forgotten them, here they are:

Corporal Works of Mercy:

Feed the hungry Give drink to the thirsty Clothe the naked Shelter the homeless Visit the sick and imprisoned Bury the dead

Spiritual Works of Mercy Admonish sinners Counsel the doubtful Bear wrongs patiently

Instruct the uninformed Comfort the sorrowful Forgive offenses

Pray for the living and the dead

If we devote ourselves to practicing these, we will go a long way to observing the Holy Year in a fitting way.

- 2. Gaudete Sunday Twice a year, the Church pauses in the midst of a season to REJOICE! As an option, clergy may wear rose colored vestments in celebration of this special Sunday. Also, it is time to light the rose (pink) candle on our Advent wreaths. Gaudete Sunday gets its name from the first word of the entrance antiphon for this Sunday: "Gaudete" which means in Latin, REJOICE!
- 3. Donations needed: Every year at St. Christopher, we try to reach out to the poor and homeless. We have a tradition of collecting GLOVES, MITTENS, AND SCARVES (FOR ADULTS AND CHILDREN) for our friends in Vinton County, St. Francis Center. Here at the parish, we collect SOCKS AND MEN'S UNDERWEAR for the homeless. When you're out at the store, you might remember to get some of these items to donate, and help make Christmas and winter a bit more comfortable for those who are disadvantaged. Merry Christmas!
- 4. Evangelization Bring a friend or family member to Church! Evangelization is a big word that simply means: "handing on the faith." In the past, we relied on the professionals to do this, the priests, brothers and sisters in religious life. With the diminishing numbers of the clergy and religious, and the increasing number of Catholics, the laity must get involved in this effort. The New Evangelization, much spoken of in today's Church, has to do with outreach to nonpracticing Catholics. All of us know some who, for whatever reason, do not practice their faith. Sometimes, all it takes is an invitation to church with us that gets them back on track. Would that all would know the strength and comfort we receive through the Sacraments of the Church. Issue that invitation to someone you care about today! Come home to the Church in 2015!
- 5. Retirement Fund for Religious One of the most popular

They weren't paid much when they were active, and their orders and institutes are in need of support for their sakes. I know you will be generous.

- 8.
