FROM THE DESK OF MSGR. JOHN CODY

Dear friends and parishioners of St. Christopher Parish:

- 1. The Feast of the Holy Family Just this past October, the Bishops of the Church gathered in Rome with our Holy Father, Pope Francis. to address the challenges of families in today's Church and world. The family will always be the basic unit of society, not only for the world, but especially for the Church. Families, including the Holy Family, have always faced difficulties and challenges. These days, no-fault divorce, drug and alcohol abuse, the pressures of the unemployment and terrorism threaten to destabilize our families, not only in the United States, but also in our world. It is imperative that we do all we can to support and uphold the value of the family: to help married couples face the challenges of life together, to provide a safe, stable and loving atmosphere for their children, and to take time to enrich their family life instead of wasting time on activities or other ventures that are not really as important as spending time with one another in our various families. Those who are single, widowed, or the last survivor in their families can create new families - extended families - among members of their communities. We all need families in whatever form to affirm us, love us, challenge us lovingly, and to help us to continue to grow as we face the events of life as we grow older. May God bless all of our families, and keep them safe and strong in the coming year, 2016.
- 2. Happy New Year! Now begins the countdown for me: just 6 ½ months until retirement. Many have asked, "Who's going to replace you?" I can honestly say that I have no idea. That's up to the Bishop, who alone has the responsibility of providing for the leadership of the parishes under his jurisdiction. Please believe that I will give him a good idea of what is happening here, and a suggested profile of someone who can lead our parish into the future. Meanwhile, pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit on Bishop Campbell there probably are about 6 of us retiring this year. May 2016 be a blessed year for all of us and those we love.
- 3. The Holy Year of Mercy Pope Francis is challenging all of us to devote ourselves to the practice of mercy. We tend to be hardhearted a lot, wanting severe punishment for everyone else but ourselves. Our Lord Jesus has said in Luke's Gospel and elsewhere, "Be merciful as your Father is merciful." This involves a change of heart on our part, and a willingness to forgive and forget especially when there are people who have hurt us. Being merciful does not mean that we let everyone get away with anything. But it is a challenge for us to reconcile with one another and to allow people to learn from their mistakes. The woman caught in adultery, Zacchaeus in the tree, and the other sinners who were outcasts in society found a friend in Jesus. We too should be ministers of reconciliation. One excellent way to observe this Holy Year is to give emphasis to the works of mercy. In case you have forgotten them, here they are:

Corporal Works of Mercy: Feed the hungry

Give drink to the thirsty

Clothe the naked Spiritual Works of Mercy:

Admonish sinners
Counsel the doubtful
Bear wrongs patiently

Shelter the homeless Visit the sick and imprisoned Bury the dead

Instruct the uninformed Comfort the sorrowful Forgive offenses

Pray for the living and the dead

If we devote ourselves to practicing these, we will go a long way to observing the Holy Year in a fitting way.

- 4. Holy Day Masses This coming octave of Christmas, December 31 and January 1 is the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. It is a Holy Day of obligation all Catholics are expected to attend Mass on the day of the Vigil, Mass: 4:30 p.m. December 31, and 10:00 a.m. only January 1.
- 5. Evangelization Bring a friend or family member to Church!

 Evangelization is a big word that simply means: "handing on the faith." In the past, we relied on the professionals to do this, the priests, brothers and sisters in religious life. With the diminishing numbers of the clergy and religious, and the increasing number of Catholics, the laity must get involved in this effort. The New Evangelization, much spoken of in today's Church, has to do with outreach to non-practicing Catholics. All of us know some who, for whatever reason, do not practice their faith. Sometimes, all it takes is an invitation to

- church with us that gets them back on track. Would that all would know the strength and comfort we receive through the Sacraments of the Church. Issue that invitation to someone you care about today! Come home to the Church in 2015!


