**FROM THE DESK OF MSGR. JOHN CODY**

Dear friends and parishioners of St. Christopher Parish:

1. **Happy Easter** – May the Risen Jesus touch our hearts and lift our eyes to rejoice in His triumph over sin and death! Easter is the premier Christian Feast – the victory of the Son over hopelessness, sin, and death. Indeed, the Risen Jesus is our hope and reason to rejoice. May this Easter be an occasion, during this Holy Year of Mercy, to reach out in mercy and forgiveness to those to whom we have become alienated for whatever reason. As God forgives, so must we. The end result is our mutual happiness – a true reason to give thanks!
2. **Congratulations to those baptized and received at the Easter Vigil!** – Each year, we are blessed with so many men and women who wish to become part of the Catholic Community. We thank Alyce Horwat and her helpers who have worked with our Catechumens and Candidates to prepare them for full Initiation into the Catholic Church. It is now up to us, the parishioners of St. Christopher, to welcome them and to integrate them into the life of our community. May they find in us welcoming friends, alive with the joy of Easter!
3. **Help for Msgr!** – I am looking for and inviting any generous souls who could help me pack in preparation for my retirement in July. I've already started, but much has to be done. This includes getting the house in order for the new Pastor, whoever in God's graciousness He and the Bishop will send us. If you have any time in the morning and afternoons on Mondays, Thursdays and Fridays, please let Jackie know at the rectory (614-486-0457).
4. **Operation Rice Bowl** – Cardboard rice bowls are available on the communion rail for those families who wish to take them and use them. Families eat more simply in order to help feed the starving of the world. All are invited to take a rice bowl home and put money saved or contributed as an alms into it. The time to return them is Holy Thursday and Good Friday or soon thereafter.
5. **BAA Pledge** – Thanks to all who have completed their BAA Pledge for 2015. There is still about \$10,000 dollars of pledges not yet paid. I would greatly appreciate it if those who have not completed their pledge would do so. And to all, thank you for supporting, this annual fund drive that funds the activities of the Diocese of Columbus, including the Tribunal, of which I am the Judicial Vicar! Your generosity is needed and appreciated!
6. **Year of Mercy** – Pope Francis is challenging all of us to devote ourselves to the practice of mercy. We tend to be hardhearted a lot, wanting severe punishment for everyone else but ourselves. Our Lord Jesus has said in Luke's Gospel and elsewhere, "Be merciful as your Father is merciful." This involves a change of heart on our part, and a willingness to forgive and forget – especially when there are people who have hurt us. Being merciful does not mean that we let everyone get away with anything. But it is a challenge for us to reconcile with one another and to allow

people to learn from their mistakes. The woman caught in adultery, Zacchaeus in the tree, and the other sinners who were outcasts in society found a friend in Jesus. We too should be ministers of reconciliation. One excellent way to observe this Holy Year is to give emphasis to the works of mercy. In case you have forgotten them, here they are:

**Corporal Works of Mercy:**

<b>Feed the hungry</b>	<b>Shelter the homeless</b>
<b>Give drink to the thirsty</b>	<b>Visit the sick and imprisoned</b>
<b>Clothe the naked</b>	<b>Bury the dead</b>

**Spiritual Works of Mercy**

<b>Admonish sinners</b>	<b>Instruct the uninformed</b>
<b>Counsel the doubtful</b>	<b>Comfort the sorrowful</b>
<b>Bear wrongs patiently</b>	<b>Forgive offenses</b>
<b>Pray for the living and the dead</b>	

If we devote ourselves to practicing these, we will go a long way to observing the Holy Year in a fitting way.

7. **Evangelization – Bring a friend or family member to Church!** – Evangelization is a big word that simply means: "handing on the faith." In the past, we relied on the professionals to do this, the priests, brothers and sisters in religious life. With the diminishing numbers of the clergy and religious, and the increasing number of Catholics, the laity must get involved in this effort. The New Evangelization, much spoken of in today's Church, has to do with outreach to nonpracticing Catholics. All of us know some who, for whatever reason, do not practice their faith. Sometimes, all it takes is an invitation to church with us that gets them back on track. Would that all would know the strength and comfort we receive through the Sacraments of the Church. Issue that invitation to someone you care about today! Come home to the Church in 2016!

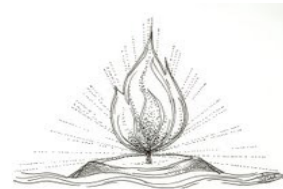
