**FROM THE DESK OF MSGR. JOHN CODY**

Dear friends and parishioners of St. Christopher Parish:

1. **Easter continues!** – May the Risen Jesus touch our hearts and lift our eyes to rejoice in His triumph over sin and death! Several years ago, Our Holy Father, St. John Paul II declared the Sunday after Easter **Divine Mercy Sunday**. This is especially appropriate during this **Holy Year of Mercy** proclaimed by our present Holy Father, Pope Francis. There are a number of places scheduling devotions for Divine Mercy Sunday, among them Holy Family and St. Mary German Village as well as Sacred Heart in Italian Village. All of us are recipients of God's mercy, and it does us well to have mercy on those who have harmed us. This takes Divine Grace – and God is always eager to extend it to us. Just ask!
2. **Congratulations to those baptized and received at the Easter Vigil!** – Each year, we are blessed with so many men and women who wish to become part of the Catholic Community. We thank Alyce Horwat and her helpers who have worked with our Catechumens and Candidates to prepare them for full Initiation into the Catholic Church. It is now up to us, the parishioners of St. Christopher, to welcome them and to integrate them into the life of our community. May they find in us welcoming friends, alive with the joy of Easter!
3. **Operation Rice Bowl** – Cardboard rice bowls are available on the communion rail for those families who wish to take them and use them. Families eat more simply in order to help feed the starving of the world. All are invited to take a rice bowl home and put money saved or contributed as an alms into it. The time to return them is in the next few weeks.
4. **Year of Mercy** – Pope Francis is challenging all of us to devote ourselves to the practice of mercy. We tend to be hardhearted a lot, wanting severe punishment for everyone else but ourselves. Our Lord Jesus has said in Luke's Gospel and elsewhere, "Be merciful as your Father is merciful." This involves a change of heart on our part, and a willingness to forgive and forget – especially when there are people who have hurt us. Being merciful does not mean that we let everyone get away with anything. But it is a challenge for us to reconcile with one another and to allow people to learn from their mistakes. The woman caught in adultery, Zacchaeus in the tree, and the other sinners who were outcasts in society found a friend in Jesus. We too should be ministers of reconciliation. One excellent way to observe this Holy Year is to give emphasis to the works of mercy. In case you have forgotten them, here they are:

**Corporal Works of Mercy:**

**Feed the hungry**  
**Give drink to the thirsty**  
**Clothe the naked**

**Shelter the homeless**  
**Visit the sick and imprisoned**  
**Bury the dead**

**Spiritual Works of Mercy**

**Admonish sinners**  
**Counsel the doubtful**  
**Bear wrongs patiently**  
**Pray for the living and the dead**

**Instruct the uninformed**  
**Comfort the sorrowful**  
**Forgive offenses**

If we devote ourselves to practicing these, we will go a long way to observing the Holy Year in a fitting way.

5. **Evangelization – Bring a friend or family member to Church!** – Evangelization is a big word that simply means: "handing on the faith." In the past, we relied on the professionals to do this, the priests, brothers and sisters in religious life. With the diminishing numbers of the clergy and religious, and the increasing number of Catholics, the laity must get involved in this effort. The New Evangelization, much spoken of in today's Church, has to do with outreach to nonpracticing Catholics. All of us know some who, for whatever reason, do not practice their faith. Sometimes, all it takes is an invitation to church with us that gets them back on track. Would that all would know the strength and comfort we receive through the Sacraments of the Church. Issue that invitation to someone you care about today! Come home to the Church in 2016!

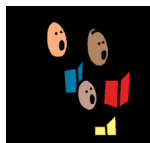

**April 3, 2016: Dorothy Day, American candidate for Sainthood** – Dorothy Day is one of the American figures singled out by Pope Francis during his recent visit to the United States (along with Thomas Merton, Abraham Lincoln, and Martin Luther King Jr.). Day founded the Catholic Worker movement, and was described by *AMERICAN Catholic Historian* as "the most significant, interesting and influential person in the history of American Catholicism." **Kathleen Riley** is a professor of history at Ohio Dominican University and a proud graduate of the University of Notre Dame. She has authored Fulton J. Sheen: An American Catholic Response to the Twentieth Century and is a member of the Cause for Beatification & Canonization of Servant of God, Fulton J. Sheen (Diocese of Peoria).
