**FROM THE DESK OF MSGR. JOHN CODY**

Dear friends and parishioners of St. Christopher Parish:

1. **June, etc.** – With June comes the end of the school year and the beginning of summer vacations. This past month has been a very busy one for me and I think also for all of you. Now, we do all we can to prepare for The Festival! We need your help volunteering, baking, working, etc. – it's a good way to meet people and a good way to get things done! We need all hands on deck to make this a success! Please be generous in volunteering and participating. In advance, thanks for your gift of self.
2. **8th Grade and High School graduation** – I know you'll join me in offering congratulations and best wishes to our Grade School and High School students graduating this year. We wish them well as they go into the future, and pray that they will always remember that we love them, appreciate them, and want very much for them to succeed in this life, and of course, in the next! As we bid farewell to yet another class of 8th graders, I can't help but thanking God for the opportunity for Catholic Education. As you know, in my 12 years here, I have been very supportive and encouraging to our parish school. I hope even more parishioners will take advantage of the excellent education we offer here. When I came to St. Christopher 12 years ago, we only had a little over 40 students registered from St. Christopher Parish. As I leave this summer, we have had over double that amount, making St. Christopher the parish with the most students in the school! Thanks to Mr. Silcott and the teachers and staff for doing a super job of offering quality, Catholic Education. Have a great and restful summer!
3. **BAA** – We are off to a good start with the BAA here at St. Christopher. Thus far, we have pledged \$60,537.01 to help us reach our goal of \$71,726.90. As I said last week, one of my goals this year is to bring up the percentage of participation. Only a little more than 25% of our parish participate in this annual fund drive. It goes without saying that the obligation to support the Church, which includes the diocese, should be borne by more than 25% of the congregation. In these days when parishes are closing and being combined with others, the financial sustainability of each parish becomes an important determinate in their continued existence. St. Christopher is in no danger of closing because of finances. However, we need not only get by: we need to prosper. We cannot do this without your generosity. Too few have carried the burden for too long. I ask each family or wage earner to consider making a pledge of **\$600**. Some can afford much more, some much less. But the important thing is participation. Christian maturity involves taking responsibility for the support of the parish Church as well as the diocesan Church. I will be saying more about this in the near future. It has been my experience that whenever a new pastor arrives, the collections drop significantly. I've had to go through this four times myself in each of my four pastorates. This predictable drop in collections is regrettable, deplorable, inexcusable, and disappointing. I will not hesitate to prepare for a new pastor without preparing all of you to welcome him and support him, which includes support of the Church. We not only owe that to him, but to the Lord Jesus who sends us a new pastor to provide us with the spiritual leadership we all need. More on this later!
4. **Goodbye Deacon David Loeffler** – Our deacon from the Josephinum this year will be leaving us soon. As is our custom for the past few years, we'd like to take up a collection as a parting gift from us, and symbolic of our prayer and gratitude for his ministry among us this past year. I will be attending Deacon David's ordination in Phoenix in mid-June and want to present him with our gift in gratitude for his service here.
5. **Year of Mercy** – Our Holy Father, Pope Francis is challenging all of us to devote ourselves to the practice of mercy. We tend to be hardhearted a lot, wanting severe punishment for everyone else but ourselves. Our Lord Jesus has said in Luke's Gospel and elsewhere, "Be merciful as your Father is merciful." This involves a change of heart on our part, and a willingness to forgive and forget – especially when there are people who have hurt us. Being merciful does not mean that we let everyone get away with anything. But it is a challenge for us to reconcile with one another and to allow people to learn from their mistakes. The woman caught in adultery, Zacchaeus in the tree, and the other sinners who were outcasts in society found a friend in Jesus. We too should be ministers of reconciliation. One excellent way to observe this Holy Year is to give emphasis to the works of mercy. In case you have forgotten them, here they are:

If we devote ourselves to practicing these, we will go a long way to observing the Holy Year in a fitting way.
6. **Evangelization** – **Bring a friend or family member to Church!** Evangelization is a big word that simply means: "handing on the faith." In the past, we relied on the professionals to do this, the priests, brothers and sisters in religious life. With the diminishing numbers of the clergy and religious, and the increasing number of Catholics, the laity must get involved in this effort. The New Evangelization, much spoken of in today's Church, has to do with outreach to nonpracticing Catholics. All of us know some who, for whatever reason, do not practice their faith. Sometimes, all it takes is an invitation to church with us to get them back on track. Would that all would know the strength and comfort we receive through the Sacraments of the Church. Issue that invitation to someone you care about today! Come home to the Church in 2016!
